15-A:- Hindi is taught in Std. VIII. There is no H.S.S. on the staff. It should be seen that the work of teaching Hindi is entrusted to qualified Hindi teacher.

24. General remarks (including remarks on the range and quality of instruction and general tone and discipline of the school)--

Shri Bhairavnath Vithya Mandir is newly started by the Bhikhan Prasarak Mandal, Pabal this year. The management is trying their best to provide all the possible facilities to the school. The school has good prospects in future as there will be a good supply of students from the local as well as the surrounding schools within the radius of about five miles from Pabal. The public of Pabal is taking keen interest in the school and I hope the present requirements of the school will be attended to soon.

At present the staff consists of two teachers. The Headmaster is a local young man and is taking keen interest in the school. His asstt. is Metric and S.T.C. with certificate in Short-Term Course, in Physical Education. He has a short experience in teaching. The portion done in all the subjects in general was found to be adequate. The detailed remarks are as follows:-

History Geography:- The portion done was adequate. The teacher has dictated notes on important topics in question and answer forms.

Marathi:- A prose lesson was observed by me. It was conducted on right lines. Difficult words and phrases were written on blackboard. The presentation was also found to be proper. The response of the class was quite good. It is suggested that the teacher should talk less and make the boys speak more.
