Principal madam greeted the members and the meeting started with availability of Quorum as per the law.

Principal madam asked if any queries/ concerns related to school academics part and addressed the concerns as listed below –

- 1) Stage daring / giving stage exposure to the school students
 - The School is conducting various activities and special assemblies where the students are given an opportunity to perform individually.
- 2) Grade 8th member mentioned for the feedback from a teacher- Mrs. Vineeta Shrivastava about the problems she was facing with the students.
 - Principal madam assured that students are positive and are overcoming the transition phase.

- 3) Absenteeism of teacher, Mrs. Tanushree, communication to be sent from school in such cases. Confusion on whatsapp groups regarding the revision worksheets.
- Mrs. Tanushree was absent for a few days due to her examination and the students were informed about the same. However, School will ensure to send a message in such cases.
 - School is following different ways to make the students practice at home by giving Friday Homework/ worksheets.
 - Revision is conducted to give an idea to students and parents about the exam pattern.
 - From 5th onwards, surprise tests are conducted to make the students study regularly.
 - School would request the parents to connect through a proper channel with the school instead of following any whatsapp group.
- 4) Classwork / homework is not getting checked regularly in some classes. If the student is absent for a few days/ a week, it becomes difficult to get the missed work. For Hindi / Marathi subject, corrections to be done vigilantly as many parents are not proficient with the languages.
- School is sending diary notes for the homework not getting submitted on time. Parents to check the communication book regularly. If the student is not submitting the homework, then a delay can be faced as the teacher can be occupied with the next lined up tasks.
 - School would request the parents to send a diary note in these cases and meet the teachers on Saturdays with an appointment.
 - For Hindi / Marathi, School will ensure that the concepts are getting clear to all the students as for languages, more focus will be on verbal communication, and will ensure that all the corrections are done precisely.
- 5) The count of boys and girls in the 6th grade is not equal
- School ensures that every section has equal number of boys and girls. However, as grade 6th has more of girl students, such unequal count in few sections.
- 6) Diary app is showing incorrect notifications. PDFs are not getting downloaded. Parents were not able to see the form sent for 'Kalamanch'.
- School to check with Mr. Rahul, the contact person of School diary app. The School admin to take a note of it and ensure that these queries are resolved.
- 7) Reading habit to be inculcated and incorporated more on regular basis.
- School is following D.E.A.R (Drop Everything And Read) on regular basis and everyone right from the ancillary staff to the School Management is devoting a time slot for reading together. A pin drop silence has been maintained during this slot and this is followed successfully every Monday.
 - School believes in overall holistic development of child. Hence, the library period is followed in which students are encouraged to read more.
 - School also has an editorial committee who is taking initiatives for School newspaper copy - 'Udaan' which is getting published every 4 months.
- 8) For grade II, giving awards should be more to encourage the students to perform better. e.g. Star of the month.
- School can implement it and increase the frequency of giving awards.
 - As the student goes to the higher grades, age appropriate motivation is given to the students as the school has to focus on discipline and academics. However, these small changes can be implemented.
- 9) For grade I, the frequency of Hindi / Marathi classes to be increased. Only Hindi / Marathi to be spoken in the respective language class.
- School ensures that the same language be spoken in the respective language class. However in grade I, the teacher needs to translate in English or Hindi to make the student understand concepts.

- Increasing the number of periods will not be possible due to balancing all the other academics and other extra-curricular activities.

- 10) Teachers to keep an eye on behavioural changes and mannerism of students in the school.
 - Teachers on the buses keep a check on student behaviour in the buses.
 - School is introducing sex education to grade 8th students.
 - Surprise bag checks are conducted by the PE faculty for grade 6th, 7th, 8th.
 - School Counselor will be taking repetitive sessions with the students of grade 7th and 8th.
- 11) The social causes like 'Giving back to Society' should be encouraged and more such activities to be planned in school.
 - 'Daan Utsav' has been scheduled in October month.
 - School will take a note of it and organise such activities on a regular basis.
- 12) The fees of 'After School Program' is high as compared to the last year.
 - Last year being the first year, the charges offered for 'After School Program' were kept minimal due to which losses had incurred. Hence the price revision for this academic session.
 - The charges depend on the number of students as well. If the count increases substantially for the next year, the charges can be reviewed again.
- 13) Breakfast menu to be shared in advance, getting posted late on the School Diary App. Teachers to give more stress on eating all the fruits.
 - School will take a note of it and will post the menu in time henceforth.
 - Fruit tiffins will be encouraged.
 - During Nutrition week, School will be posting a menu to follow.
- 14) Career guidance sessions / skill development sessions to be introduced for higher grades.
 - School invites parents who have the expertise in those areas to conduct these sessions.
 - The parent of Rudraksh Mishra(Grade VIII) showed interest for conducting the session on skill development.
 - School has noted it and will organise such sessions in future, for grade 9th and 10th.
- 15) Poor road construction at the entrance and dumping yard in the adjacent area.
 - School had issued letters to the respective Government bodies and it has been approved.
 - Repairing of school road will start after Diwali. Gram Panchayat has already allocated funds for the same.
 - Dumping yard cleaning is under process, needs some approvals.
- 16) Students should be able to participate in any other categories in Sport ZP Competitions other than the sports.
 - School PE faculty is taking a note of these students and registering them for ZP matches. Students are also participating in all the other categories which are not held at School.
- 17) Update on CBSE Affiliation work.
 - CBSE Affiliation documentation work has already in process. We are expecting CBSE Affiliation before the commencement of new academic session.
- 18) Construction of new school building.
 - Present school building is sufficient to cater the need of next academic session 2024-25. Construction of new building will start as per the requirement of new class rooms.

The concerns were addressed and the meeting ended by giving the positive feedback from the ECPTA members on the following points-

- Effective school communication on all the work done in the classroom during the week.
- Activities are getting planned, executed very well and in an organised manner.
- Student teacher bond is very strong across all the grades.
- Parent feel secured to see that their wards are in good hands.

Principal Madam announced about new class teacher appointed for grade IV and VII, introduced Mrs. Shefali Karkera (Grade VII) and informed that Mrs. Smruti Pandalwar has left the organisation due to medical reasons. In place of Smruti Pandalwar, a new teacher has been appointed for Social Science subject.

The meeting concluded by extending the vote of thanks by respected Principal Madam to all the ECPTA members.
